Recommendation 1 fails to emphasise the bipartisan agreements made in regard to the Basin Plan and for the need for all jurisdictions to honour these agreements. Support for regional communities with properly targeted and efficient investment programs to assist in diversification and less reliance on water dependent industries is supported. No compensation or 'off-set' funding to private individuals or corporations should be considered

Clear analysis of the most efficient way to recover the agreed volumes of water in the Basin Plan and the best way to build regional community resilience. There is a failure to recognise the socio-economic benefits of ecosystem services provided by a healthy river system

Implement water reform with greater care so potential harms are minimised

- Moving towards more sustainable irrigation infrastructure

10. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the Panel's key findings and recommendations, and why? Please provide as much detail as possible.

We strongly disagree with Rec 2 - water recovery has been at a standstill during the drought and is now needed to assist collapsing ecosystems. There should be no further delays. There are other constraints besides the Barmah Choke. We agree that fixing constraints on water delivery must be given high priority. Tracking of investment for regional economic purposes should be included in Rec 14 There is no support for off-farm infrastructure projects.

There is no consideration of the ongoing harm to ecosystems and river health and the cost to communities. The failure to analyse the value of ecosystem services is a failing of the Draft report

Delaying water recovery will not assist communities in the Lower Darling or lower Murray

Better management of water security for towns is essential for the long-term. This should not be based on seeking additional water sources but on more efficient water allocation in regulated river systems and more efficient use within urban areas. We support improved funding for front line services and digital connectivity for remote rural and regional communities. This regional development approach should be separated out from Basin Plan considerations.

14. Are there any significant gaps? What are we missing?

The issue of water quality and costs to communities has not been considered. The Basin Plan salinity target has not been included in the assessment.

The recommendations to improve funding for services will enhance local economies more than investment in infrastructure to recover water.
